

Learning Wet or Dry?

Learning the difference between wet or dry

Is **key** to potty training. Some kids learn best by seeing the difference, while others learn best by feeling it. Understanding your child's prevailing learning style not only does wonders in the potty training department-it can go a long way in helping you adapt life lessons.

Turn this card over for ideas to consider for each learning style:



If your child learns best by **SEEING** wet or dry:

- ★ Cut out color paper shapes for your child. Then dip them into a glass of water to show what wet looks like.
- ★ See who can find the most wet and dry things as you go through your day using everyday activities like washing hands, bathtime, cooking ingredients or even art activities as examples.

If your child learns best by **FEELING** wet or dry:

- ★ Have your child examine a dry cloth or cloth underwear. Have them dunk it in a bowl of water and examine it again. Repeat.
- ★ Have a little scavenger hunt to find other objects for your child to dunk and talk about how wet and dry feel. Have fun with it!
